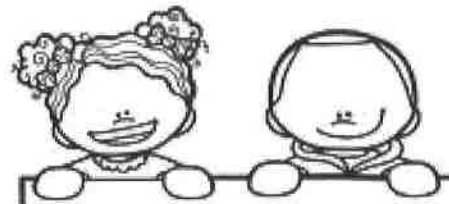


## Ways to ENGAGE your children in LEARNING THE BIBLE

1. Use the Bible App.
  - a. In the technology generation in which we live, I truly believe that teaching our kids the importance of having a Bible app installed on their devices and using apps to grow their spiritual walk is vital.
2. Create Together
  - a. When you get out the play-do or paper and markers.. maybe you bake a loaf of bread you get the attention of your child. When you engage and be present with your children, they are more apt to listen and be vulnerable.
3. Stimulate the Sense.
  - a. After you create something together, especially memories, that is a visual stimulation. Talk about how the bread smells, the beauty of the artwork.
4. Ask Discussion Questions.
  - a. Key thing : Don't give all the answers.
    - i. Ask your child(ren) what they are thinking and encourage them to share their thoughts about details that aren't given.
5. Act out the Bible Lesson or Scriptures
  - a. Whatever the lesson, think of a simple way you can follow through to put action behind the meaning.
6. Allow other adults to speak wisdom in their lives, too!
  - a. We realize it can be overwhelming to be the primary means of teaching your children faith. Why not bring them to church and introduce them to the leaders, pastors, and volunteers! IT TAKES A VILLAGE!

While these 6 ways to engage your children in learning the Bible at home seem simple enough, We understand it's easy to lose focus on how important it is to prioritize our faith. Teaching them throughout the week, especially at home, can be more enjoyable and doable than trying to cram everything in in one setting.

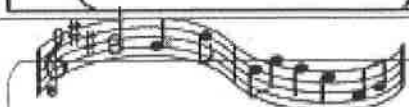

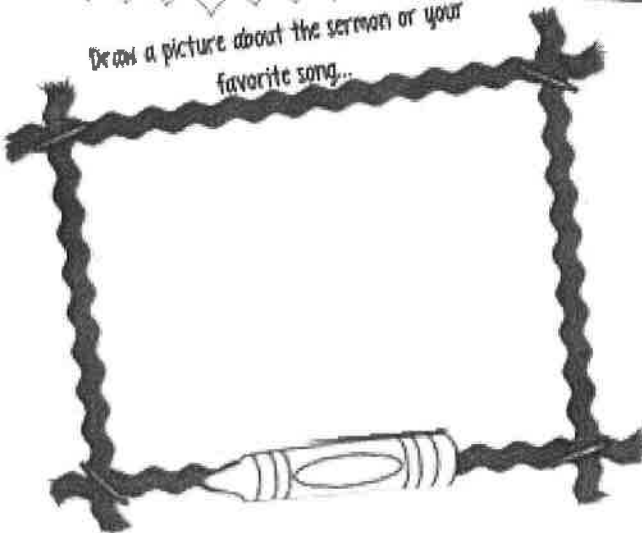

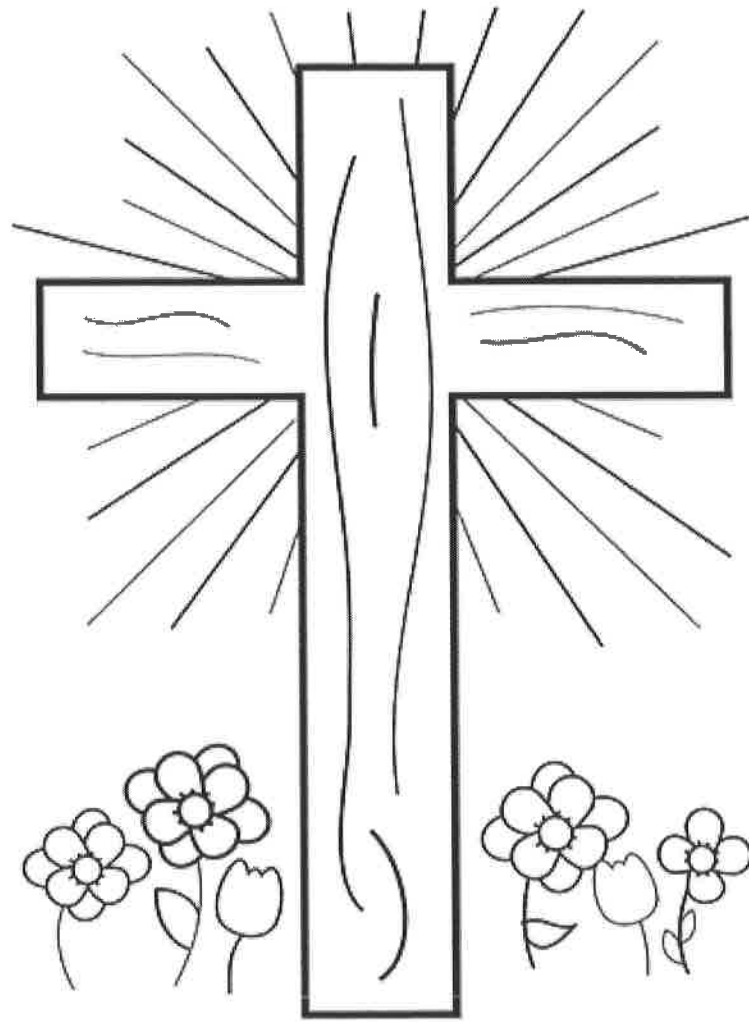
